IMJIN 60

2011 marks the sixtieth anniversary of the defining battle of the Korean War, the Battle of the Imjin River (22-25 April 1951). This is a special exhibition to commemorate the Battle, in which approximately 4,500 soldiers of the UK 29th Independent Infantry Brigade, including 866 officers and men of the Gloucestershire Regiment, withstood the advance of around 27,000 men of the 63rd Chinese Army.

It was for their heroism at Imjin that the regiment was to earn the soubriquet 'The Glorious Glosters'.
